

Email

- Email programs
 - Outlook
 - Mac Mail
 - Windows 8 Mail app
- Web-based email
 - Gmail
 - Charter
 - MSN (Soon to be Outlook.com)
 - Verizon



Email - Desktop vs. web

Desktop program

- Advantages
 - Keeping control of your mail
- Disadvantages
 - Can only access mail from your primary computer (If your computer breaks, you may lose your email.)
 - Search may be slow if you have a lot of email

Web mail

- Advantages
 - Access anywhere
- Disadvantages
 - Advertisements
 - Integration with some desktop programs
 - Limited offline access



Downloads

- When you download an attachment, it typically goes to your Download folder.
- Some mail programs will let you see the image in the messages without downloading.
- You need to have a program on your computer that can open the attachment.
 - Word for .doc or .docx files
 - Acrobat Reader for .pdf

- Emptying trash folder





- Your Apple Id
 - Used to download and buy applications from the App Store
 - Used to buy music from iTunes.

 - Mine aren't








Important, but not so tasty cookies









Files and folders on phones and tablets

- Tablets and phones don't let you browse files and folders in the same way as desktop systems.
- Access controlled via apps
- iPad is even more restricted.



Tips

- Common folder names
 - Documents
 - Pictures (and/or Photos)
 - Videos (and/or Movies)
 - Music
- What works best is what works for you.
 - You can keep files of any type in any folder.
 - The folder names are generally just suggestions.
- Use search to find files and folders on your system
 - Windows 囲F
 - Mac #F



Photographs

- Your system setup determines what happens when you insert a memory card or USB drive into your computer.
 - In this class, we might have 20 different ways of transferring photos to computers.
- If you have a photo management program, that program will usually copy the files to your computer.
 - Programs that came with your computer
 - Programs you purchased
- You can also copy files directly to a folder of your choice.



Photo management programs

- Each system has a built-in program
 - Windows Live Photo Gallery
 - Preview and iPhoto
- If you don't already have one:
 - Picasa (by Google), Windows and Mac, free
- For simple editing,
 - Irfanview (Windows only), free
