




The education system is based on a framework from the 17th and 18th century that says we should play for the first five years of life, then learn, then work, then rest and then die.

"It's odd that no matter what you decide to study [in college], it's exactly four years," Khan says. 



Figure 2. Decay in the truth of knowledge in the areas of hepatitis and cirrhosis. The 50 percent mark is around forty-five years, meaning it takes about forty-five years for half of the knowledge in these fields to be overturned. From Poynard, et al. "Truth Survival in Clinical Research: An Evidence-Based Requiem?" Annals of Internal Medicine 136, no. 12 (2002): 888–95.










Dear NOOK for iPad & iPhone Customer.

We'll soon be releasing an update to your NOOK App that will fully support iOS7. In the meantime, if you're planning to upgrade your iPhone or iPad with tomorrow's release of iOS7, we wanted to tell you about two short-term issues you might experience with your NOOK App:

- If you rotate the screen while reading, it may cause the page to render incorrectly or may
  cause the app to crash. To prevent this, we suggest locking the rotation while reading.
  Click here for iPad instructions and here for iPhone instructions.
- If you sign out of your app and then sign in again, the app may crash or you may have trouble accessing your Library.

Please note that not everyone will experience these issues. And for those who do, be assured we are working as quickly as we can to resolve them.

Once the new version is ready, your app should update automatically unless you've changed the iTunes settings to update manually. In that case, be on the lookout for a prompt that will let you know when your NOOK app is ready to update.

In the meantime, we apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.
