




The world of work has changed

December, 2013




We're not keeping pace with change

Nearly 30% of users are using Windows XP, a 12year-old operating system that will be unsupported in April 2014.





EXHIBIT III. Postulated Consequence of Anxiety Reduction







Understand our risk tolerance






