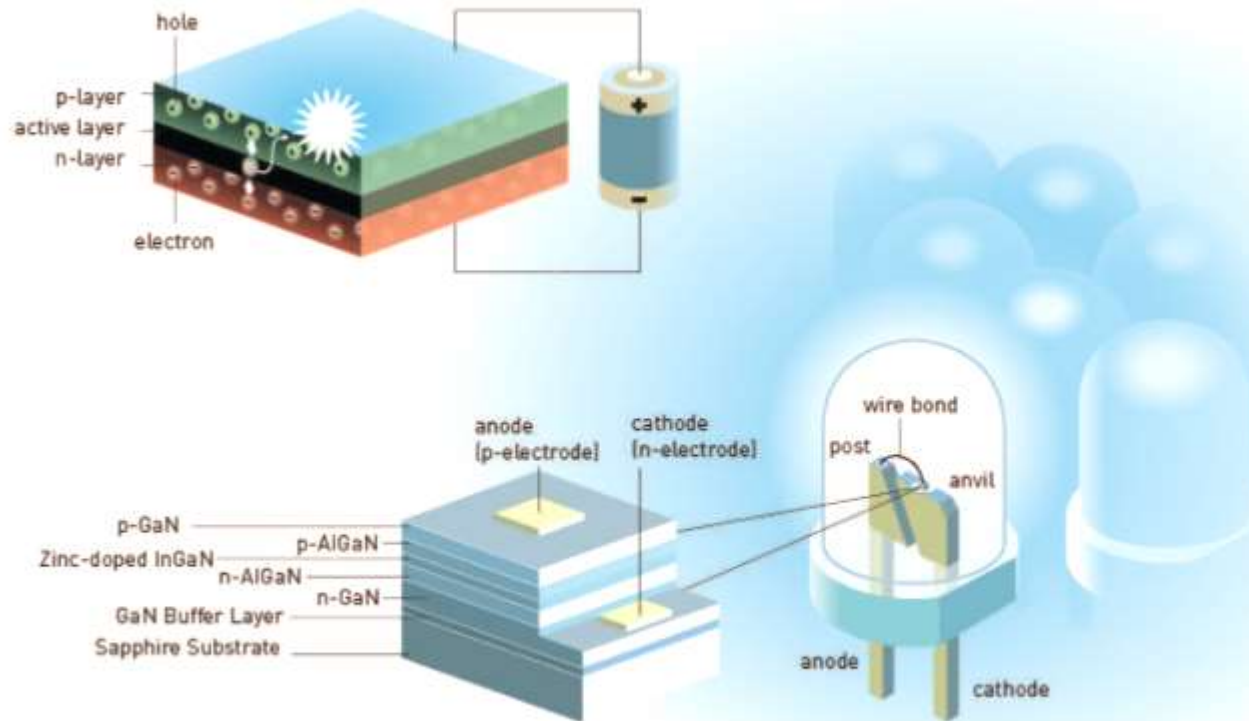

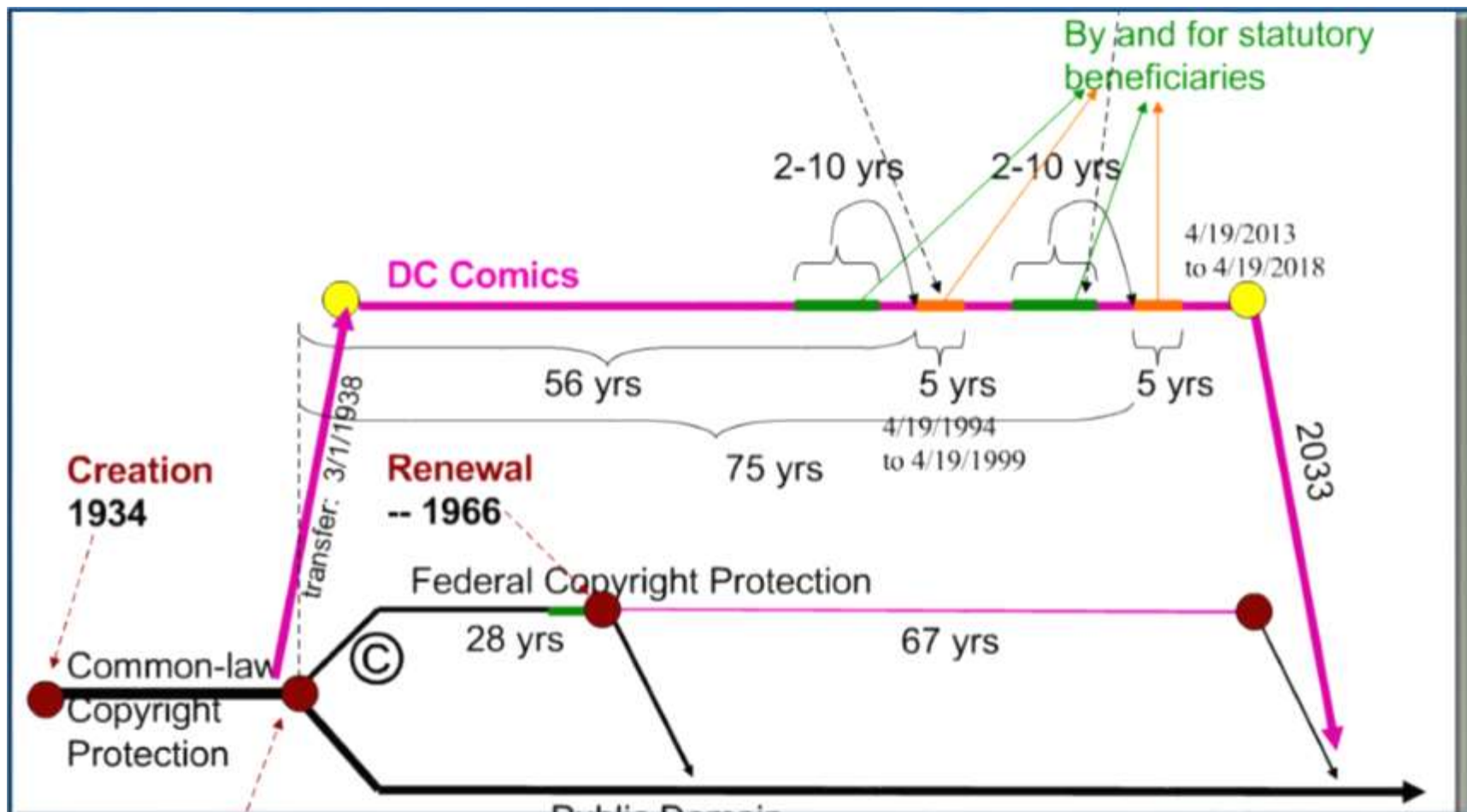

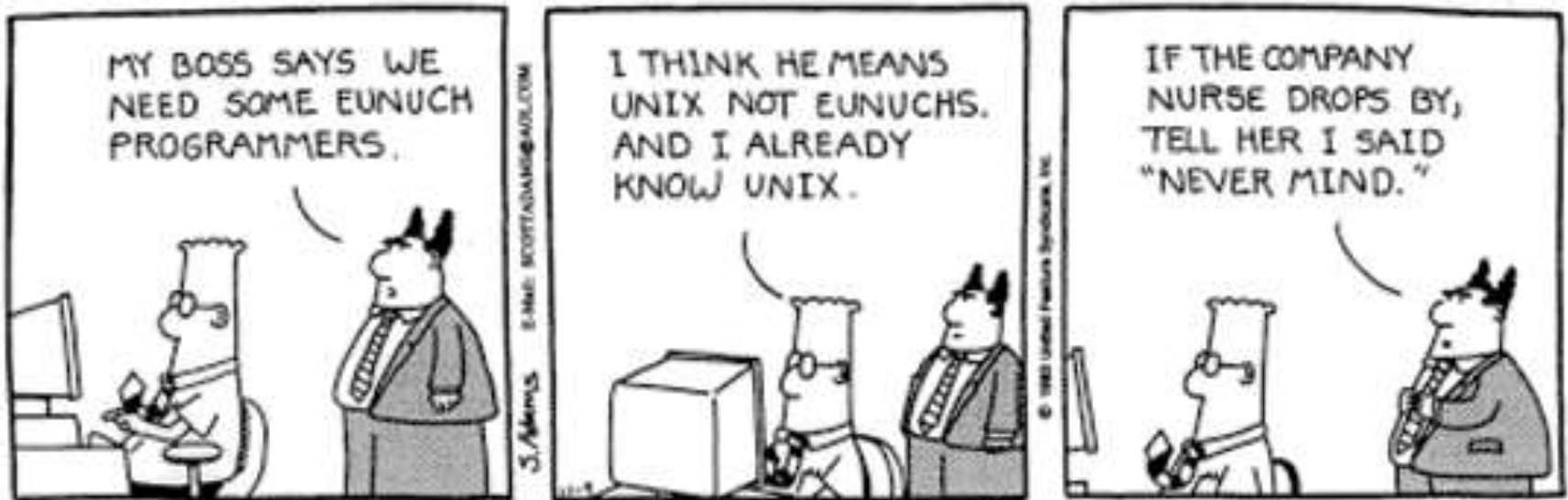

- ▶ An operating system developed at AT&T Labs in 1969
- ▶ Runs on just about every computing platform
- ▶ UNIX® is a registered trademark of The Open Group.

The big thinkers

- ▶ Richard Stallman
 - GNU – GNU's not UNIX
 - 1977 – Developed [GNU Emacs](#)
 - 1983 – Developed [GNU Operating System](#)
 - 1985 – Established [Free Software Foundation](#)
- ▶ Linus Torvalds
 - 1991 – first release of the Linux kernel
 - 1992 – released under Gnu Public License



Free, as in ...

“Free software” is a matter of liberty, not price. To understand the concept, you should think of “free” as in “free speech,” not as in “free beer.”

Open source license types

- ▶ Copyleft
 - Software developed under this principle can only be redistributed under the same terms.
 - Free must stay free.
- ▶ GPL
- ▶ Creative Commons

GNU Copyleft

The legal meaning of the GNU copyleft is less important than the spirit, which is that Emacs is a free software project and that work pertaining to Emacs should also be free software. “Free” means that all users have the freedom to study, share, change and improve Emacs. To make sure everyone has this freedom, pass along source code when you distribute any version of Emacs or a related program, and give the recipients the same freedom that you enjoyed.

Real, personal, and intellectual property

- ▶ If someone appropriates your real or personal property, you can no longer use it.
 - It can't be reproduced.
 - You can be made whole by return or restitution.
- ▶ If someone appropriates your intellectual property, you still have it.
 - A digital copy is identical to the original.
 - Its value has been diminished by an unknown amount.

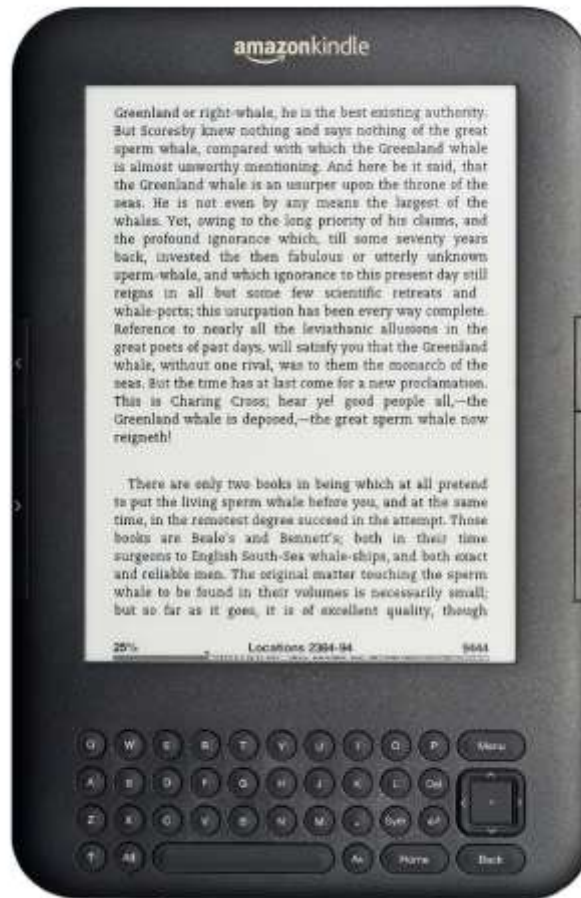
