









Universal Basic Income



Donald Rumsfeld, the young former Congressman from Illinois whom President Nixon named to head the O.E.O., thinks that the implications of

the New Jersey experiment are important. It is evident to him, as it is to many others, that the welfare system is a shambles, and he sees the experiment as a demonstration of the possibility of moving away from a cumbersome bureaucracy toward a streamlined program based on maximum reliance on the individual.


"When you look at period like the nineteen-sixties—with high employment, low unemployment and at the same time escalating dependency—you ask yourself what would be the story in less prosperous times," Rumsfeld explains. "When this happens in such a period of general national prosperity, it's obvious something has to be wrong with the present system. So let's get at it, let's find out what's wrong, and let's change it."
