Eisenhower Opposed a Nixon Recount

WASHINGTON, April 5— President Eisenhower advised Richard M. Nixon not to demand a recount of 1960 election returns in two states in an effort to win the Presidential race against John F. Kennedy.

General Eisenhower's advice to his Vice President is one of a number of reminiscences coming to light among old associates of the five-star general, who was buried Wednesday at Abilene, Kan

The associates also recalled that after his second election, President Eisenhower toyed with the idea of starting a "suprapartisan" third - party mevement because of his great plurality over other candidates on the Republican ticket for Congressional, state and municipal offices.

The unpublished anecdotes were recounted after his death in fond recollection of the man who disliked "politics" in the narrow partisan sense because he said he had no "feel" for the art, but who succeeded at it because he epitomized the simple virtues of American life and enjoyed an unparalleled popularity.

One remembered incident involved a remark made by General Eisenhower several years after he left the White House.

He described Mr. Nixon as the one man best qualified by experience to be President

"There is no question in my mind that Dick Nixon is best qualified of any of the available candidates to be President of the United States. But it's a funny thing about Dick. Almost everywhere I go people tell me they don't like him. I just don't understand it."





- SCOTUS in Bush v. Gore applied a different standard, based on <u>Presidential Electors Clause</u>















- <u>The "shy Trump voters" debate, explained</u>






